## **What Are We Here For?!**

I'm speaking of our Annual Financial Meeting which we usually think of as money and numbers, translated...zzzz. While they are important, no doubt, there is something more important—purpose. Why does South Church exist? As the cultural context in which we live shifts this is a question we need to visit again and again.

The shift to which I refer is the drop in church attendance and membership. The CT Conference of the U.C.C. dropped 14.3% since 2011 while South Church dropped 11.8%. The experts call it a national trend. The church of the 70's and 80's is quickly disappearing and we aren't sure yet, what will replace it. Comparatively speaking, we are doing well, we have: the second largest average attendance in the Farmington Valley Association at 140; 45 kids in Kaleidoscope Corner; 47 youth touched by our programs; 56 people participating in adult groups and retreats; and yet, we are still being affected by the downturn, both in attendance and our financial numbers.

We invested the sale of the Avery House (the house next door) proceeds into staffing, in an effort to reverse the trend. That is one of the reasons, I believe, that we are doing better than the average. We come to the end of those monies at the end of this year.

While this information provides the context, it begs the question of purpose. I believe that our purpose is to reveal, in word and deed, the transformative power of God who is Love and holds all things together. We reveal it to children, who wonder if they belong; to youth, who hope they are acceptable and competent; to adults, who seek direction, meaning and community; and to any person or people who are treated as less than human.

I hope that everyone of you can be at the Financial Meeting to, in congregational fashion, lend your voice to the conversation of how we spend our monies to achieve our purpose!!

January began the year with an explosion of musical activities. After a small interruption by a Weather Event, our **CHOIR** joined with First Church's choir on two anthems at the union service (rescheduled from Jan. 20) on January 27<sup>th</sup> at First Church. Music Directors Julie Hagen and Mattie Banzhaf shared conducting duties, and the combined choir made glorious harmonies. Our own **Becky Sears** was the soloist for the beautiful "MLK" composed by Bob Chilcott of the rock group U2. The traditional-style "Ain't Got Time to Die" by Hall Johnson featured Julie Hagen as the soloist. Both these numbers were sung a cappella, meaning unaccompanied – a daring and effective stretch for the singers, who cherish these chances to sing together and challenge their abilities. Some of them even do double duty as members of the House Band, which played throughout the service, including two hymns composed by Rev. Denny Moon.

**The Bruce Porter Memorial Music Series continued** in January with a very interesting event. Organist extraordinaire Jason Roberts returned from New York City, where he has been organist at St. Bartholomew's, to extemporize on our organ and play masterworks of the organ repertoire. Bach's engaging transcription of a concerto by Vivaldi was followed by magnificent pieces by Widor, Mozart, Saint-Saens, and finally an original, extemporaneous improvisation on a theme provided by Mattie Banzhaf.

**On Sunday March 10<sup>th</sup>**, the Hartt College Chorale and Chamber Singers will make their debut appearance on the **Bruce Porter Memorial Music Series** with an afternoon of choral beauty and virtuosity. Led by Dr. Ed Bolkovac, these groups comprise some of the finest music students at the school: vocal majors, aspiring opera stars, musical theater specialists and other accomplished singers. Then on **Sunday, April 28<sup>th</sup>**, **Les Amies de Theodore** with guest violinist **Emlyn Ngai** will play pieces of Baroque beauty and virtuosity. Remember to mark your calendar with these dates, and please help spread the word about all these splendid musical events.

Sing on! The Hartt Chamber Choir, under the direction of Edward Bolkovac, will be joined by the Hartt Chorale, under the direction of Benjamin Rauch, in an eclectic program that includes exquisite works from the Renaissance period, Schubert's charming *Mass in G*, as well as modern works by Christopher Theofanidis, Pierre Villette, and Eric Barnum, and some settings of spirituals by Moses Hogan and Carol Barnett. A splendid choral offering not to be missed!

**The Hartt Chorale** is a mixed SATB chorus of 35 to 45 singers that performs a wide variety of *a cappella* and accompanied repertoire from the Baroque period to the present day.

**The Hartt Chamber Choir** is a highly skilled auditioned chorus of 24 singers that sings choral works by composers such as J.S. Bach, Handel and Mozart as well as works by contemporary composers. Members of the Hartt Chamber Choir have formed the core of the Hartt Tour Choir when they have performed in the Czech Republic, Spain, Hungary and Italy.

The BPMMS is now in its seventh season of sponsoring excellent concerts of classical music in Granby. The final concert on the 2018-2019 Season will be *Les Amies de Théodore*, a Baroque Chamber Ensemble, with guest violinist Emlyn Ngai, on Sunday, April 28th, at 4 pm.

Thanks to a grant from the Granby Education Foundation, the music ministry of South Church, and donations from supporters of the series, we are able to continue offering concerts of classical music and jazz. Admission to the concerts are free, with a suggested donation of \$10 at the door.

**YOUTH NEWS AND HAPPENINGS!!**

As South Church begins to think about the next phase of its youth ministry, I thought it would be helpful to look at who we're reaching and how. Through our Faith Journey, YES! Group, O.W.L. program, 2 Service Trips (Heads Up! Hartford & Reach Beyond Mission) and Silver Lake, we reached 47 youth (7-12th grade) during 2018:

- South Church youth reached: 31
- East Hartland youth reached: 1
- East Granby youth reached: 7
- Non church affiliated youth reached: 8

Of those 47, 23 youth were involved in 2-6 programs.

For these ministries to sustain & grow their reach, we ask for your prayers, financial & spiritual support, and IDEAS! Our programs are always evolving; all feedback and input is welcome. We're currently exploring widening our circle to work with Center Church in Hartford for a couple of service & youth group events in the spring.


